

## Known Disparities Among LGBTQ Populations

#### Youth:

- 40% of clientele served by homeless youth providers (43% were kicked out)<sup>1</sup>
- 42% of non-binary youth have attempted suicide<sup>2</sup>

#### General:

- 1.6X more likely to be food insecure<sup>3</sup>
- Higher rates of HIV transmission among MSM of color<sup>4</sup>
- Lesbian and bisexual women greater risk of obesity<sup>4</sup>

#### **Older Adults:**<sup>5</sup>

- Avoid or delay health care, or conceal identity
- Less likely to have children or close family for support
- Greater financial risk (Hispanic lesbian couples of color highest rate)



## Resiliency

### Aging with Pride Study (NIH funded)


- 91% engage regularly in wellness activities.
- 89% feel positive about belonging to their LGBT communities.
- 38% attend spiritual or religious activities at least once a month.
- 41% of transgender older adults, 41% of bisexual men, and 34% of gay men have served in the military.







- Ask EVERYONE! or no one at all
- Don't be afraid to ask<sup>1</sup>
  - Census Bureau Experiment
    - More skipped income than SOGI
    - 90% felt comfortable being asked
- Practice makes perfect
  - Training strongly recommended
  - Role play with coworkers
- Be prepared for the answer

- What is your gender? (check only one)

- What was your sex at birth? (check only one)
  - Male
  - Female
  - Intersex
