


EHR checklist for behavioral health facilities

Patient safety

Provide real-time alerts and prompts to reduce manual steps?
Allow multiple users to be in the same record at the same time?
Administer the right medication dose based on sliding scales for Clinical Institute Withdrawal Assessment for Alcohol scores and pain levels?
Automatically trigger interventions to prevent adverse events, including missed medication or the over-administering of medication?
Have a built-in accountability record that allows staff to complete patient rounding on mobile devices, including iPads and tablets for Q15 and Q5 safety checks?
Have bar coded medication administration that ensures the right dose for the right medication at the right time?
